all sums of money due me by the Confed-
erate States of America on account of
services rendered in the Confederate
Army by my self J.W. Amick dec'd late
member of Co I 15th Regt. S.C. and
upon receipt of or any part thereof to deli-
ver sufficient acquittances and receipts
for the same, and further to do
all acts and things whatsoever concerning
the premises, as fully and as effectually
in my name, as I could do if I were
personally present: hereby ratifying and
confirming all my said attorney shall
lawfully do or cause to be done in and
about the premises.
