The 1st Cavalry Legion was organized from field officers: one of whom, to command the Cavalry portion. This was rightly Lieut. Col. Shingle, who was subsequently promoted to Colonel, & permitted by the Secretary of War (John Randolph) to remain with the Cavalry. Since Shingle's pro- motion, no promotion had been made in the Legion up to the time of the reorganiza- tion, except Lieut. Col. Conant, (who, since his promotion, has been an invalid). There were then two vacancies to be filled by seniority - classes, to which Capt. Conant, of the Inf., & Capt. M. Kinsick, of the Cavalry, were entitled. They had not actually been promoted; but in any organiza- tion, the right must have been regarded.

In the reorganization, one of these

field officers was necessarily assigned to the Cavalry; and the other to the Infantry. It was determined that the Colo- nel Shingle should remain with the Cavalry, & he was assigned to command the new Regiment of which it forms a part; and Lieut. Conant & M. Kinsick was due to the Infantry. M. Kinsick declined to go to Infantry, being a Cavalry officer; & preferred to retain his commission as Captain. This left two full officers for the Infantry. Elliott was ap- pointed to this as Colonel. The appl. of Elliott was an error, though to have been given to Holt, the next Captain, promote to Major. Elliott has been set aside, this will now be done.

The reorganization was recon- sidered, and it was determined that Shingle should command the Infantry. This then a Major (M. Kinsick) with the Cavalry Regt. went, in his stead; and changed the original vacancies (from Lieut. Col. Shingle) to Colonel and Lieut. Colonel. In the Lieut. Colonelcy, the names of Boykin and Hamilton was pro-

posed. Holt was a recon- sideration M. Kinsick made Lieut. Colonel. This leaves the Major's place vacant; to be filled by seniority, viz M. Kinsick, if an argument be correct.

these Companies have yet been filed.

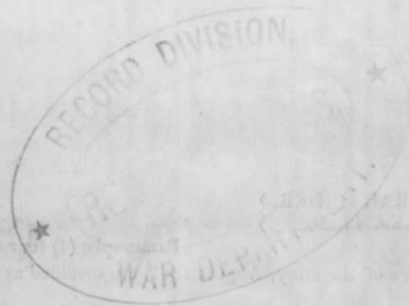
Gen. Pemberton recommends that

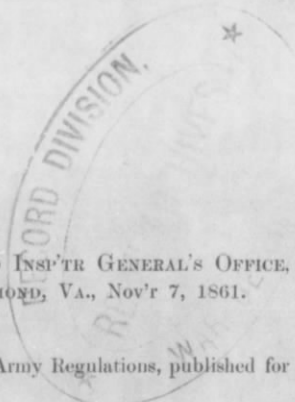

GENERAL ORDER, }
No. 17. }

Paragraphs (4) four and (5) five of Army Regulations, published for
guidance of the army, August 1861, are modified as follows:

IV. "Whenever a non-commissioned officer or soldier shall be unfit for military service in consequence of wounds, disease, or infirmity, his Captain shall forward through the Commander of the Regiment or Battalion to the Brigade Commander or other officer next higher in rank to the Commander of the Regiment or Battalion, a statement of the case, with a 'certificate of disability,' signed by the Medical Officer having charge of the invalid, with a recommendation for discharge or furlough, as the case may require; and if the recommendation be approved, the authority for discharge or furlough shall be endorsed on the 'certificate of disability,' which shall then be returned to the Commanding Officer of the Regiment or Battalion, who will cause the proper papers to be made out—

I inclose
you a letter from Capt Rodgers
Comdy Co B, of Gordon under
my command. He is stationed
as you may be aware near
Murrells Inlet. I also send
you a copy of the orders for
transfer forwarded to me
by Genl Garlington. I sent
a copy of the order to Capt
Rodgers thinking it would
be sufficient to guide him
but by the tone of his letter
he seems to be completely

at a loss what to do and
has permitted apparently his
company to be taken out of
his hands. I would respectfully
submit these papers to you and
draw your attention to these
facts, as you have no opportu-
nity of knowing how the matter
stands. The companies were to
be turned over to Confederate
service with their existing
organization, and the elections
in Capt Rodgers Co by Steele
and others are illegal and
without authority. I had received
orders relieving me from duty here
and to report to you at Serge-
-town. I regret to say that
in consequence of reports of
disturbances in the mountain
portion of North Carolina almost

with out foundation and intention-
ally exaggerated. The order to
be moved has been revoked
and we are still here. I
would respectfully ask
General your intervention in
getting us moved back to
your District. Desertions being
broken up and General Long-
-street occupying East Tennessee
there is no use for us here
and it would be desirable
to get the two companies
together again. If General
Brewster could realize the
little use there is for us here
he would not care to keep us
I remain General yours

I am not well & has been sick several days the company has got in a stew & refused to muster in under the present officers in Confederate Service & till an Election without any orders whatever and elected officers & made a muster roll & has gone up to General Seapin asking him now to muster them in which I hope will be done soon as the company has left me out. I hope I will have the chance to go to my home for a while.

Since the company refused to muster in Confederate Service I have discharged those persons not liable to Conscript.

The company now stands in their
last organization of 1861
J. M. Smith, 1st, The Welch 2d & 3d
of 1861
