The 1st Regiment Tennessee Infantry was organized January 1, 1862, with eight companies, A to H. Company I was organized about February 27, 1862, and Company K about March 1, 1862. A portion of the regiment was captured at Fort Donelson, Tenn., February 16, 1862, released at Vicksburg, Miss., in September, 1862, and declared exchanged at Alken's Landing, Va., November 10, 1862. The part of the regiment not captured and Companies I and K were united with the 52d Regiment Tennessee Infantry by S. O. No. 40, Hdqrs. 2d Corps, Army of Mississippi, dated April 23, 1862, and formed the 51st Regiment Tennessee Infantry (Consolidated). This action was declared illegal by the War Department and the regiments were re-organized and the men assigned to their original companies in April, 1863. The regiments were again consolidated May 27, 1863, but each company was mustered separately and under its original designation during the period covered by this consolidation.

About April 9, 1863, the 11th, 12th, 13th, 20th, 47th, 50th, 51st, 52d and 154th Regiments Tennessee Infantry were consolidated and formed the 2d Consolidated Regiment Tennessee Infantry, which was paroled at Greensboro, N. C., May 2, 1865.

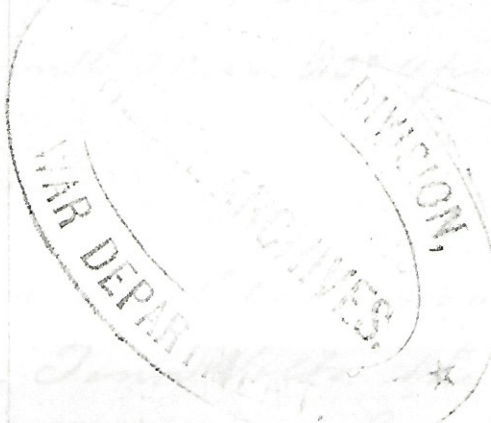

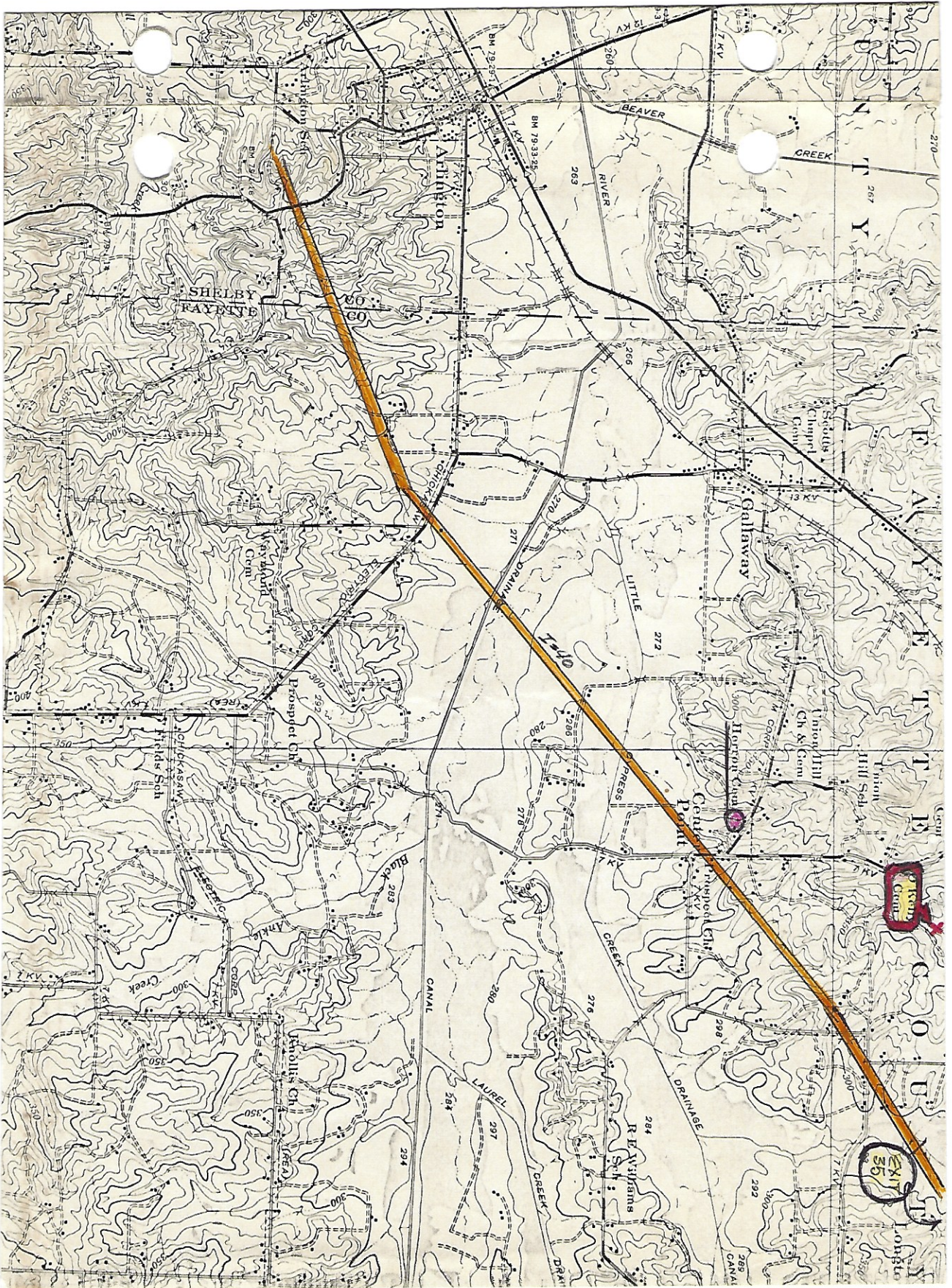
