VICKSBURG, MISSISSIPPI, JULY 10<sup>th</sup> A. D. 1863.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN, KNOW YE THAT:

I *Amos A. Sheffield* a *Private* of Co. *E 43* Reg't  
*Ala.* Vol., C. S. A., being a Prisoner of War, in the hands  
of the United States Forces, in virtue of the capitulation of the City of Vicks-  
burg and its Garrison, by Lieut. Gen. John C. Pemberton, C. S. A., Command-  
ing, on the 4th day of July, 1863, do in pursuance of the terms of said capitula-  
tion, give this my solemn parole under oath—

That I will not take up arms again against the United States, nor serve in  
any military, police, or constabulary force in any Fort, Garrison or field work,  
held by the Confederate States of America, against the United States of Amer-  
ica, nor as guard of prisons, depots or stores, nor discharge any duties usually  
performed by officers or soldiers against the United States of America until  
duly exchanged by the proper authorities.
